Methodist Chapel was one of 26 images chosen by Sir Kenneth Clark for the 1940 Venice Bienale, held in London due to WWII. Hodgkins discusses the significance of this selection in a letter to her brother, Willie Hodgkins: '...an invitation from the British Council to represent British Art at the Biennial Exhibition in Venice in April - that is to fill a large sized Room in the British Pavilion, the other painters being Duncan Grant, Wadsworth & Munnings - each with a Room of their own - a very considerable compliment to your sister one is assumed to be either eminent or dead - perhaps a bit of both - before you can qualify for this honour - it is a very important exhibition.
